In addition, Mike Getz of UNDERGROUND CINEMA-12 customarily attends the Festival and selects films for presentation at leading theatres throughout the country. Last year six different programs of films were screened at 18 theatres, and film makers were paid \$1.00 a minute. Participating film makers shared nearly \$12,000.00 in fees. A similar arrangement is expected this year.
