WE ARE SADDENED BY THE ELIMINATION OF THEIR POSITIONS AT MICHIGAN MEDIA, AND ADVOCATE THAT THE UNIVERSITY OF MICHIGAN REASSESS ITS POSITION CONCERNING THE FUTURE OF FILM-MAKING IN ITS CURRICULUM.
