To encourage the work of the independent producer and to promote the concept of the film as art, the CINEMA GUILD of The University of Michigan, in cooperation with the DRA-MATIC ARTS CENTER of Ann Arbor, takes pleasure in announcing the FIFTH ANN ARBOR FILM FESTIVAL.

RULES AND CONDITIONS

The competition is open to all films that evidence a high regard for the film as a creative medium, but excepting those films that have been entered in any previous ANN ARBOR FILM FESTIVAL.

All prints must be 16mm and in good condition. Films in danger of damage due to faulty or excessive splices, torn sprocket holes, etc., will not be accepted.

Otherwise there are no limitations on the films.

Awards in Ann Arbor will be: First Prize, \$300.00; Second Prize, \$200.00; Third Prize \$100.00; The Prix de Devarti, \$25.00; A Prize by Peter and Charlotte Darrow, \$25.00 and a Prize by Aune and Ingrid Manupelli, \$25.00.

An entry form must be completed for each film entered and should be received in Ann Arbor not later than February 15, 1967. (Enclose \$2.00 entry fee per film maker.)

Films should be sent so as to reach Ann Arbor also by February 15, 1967.

In certain cases, late arrivals will be accepted.

Following the screenings in Ann Arbor, additional screenings of the festival films will take place at leading institutions and theatres throughout the country.


Any film selected for screening in Ann Arbor is automatically qualified for the tour and may be so circulated unless otherwise specified by the entrant.

Places, dates, and awards for the tour are: UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MILWAUKEE, March 16-18, \$200.00 in awards; UNIVERSITY OF WISCONSIN-MADISON, March 19-20, \$200.00 in awards; CRANBROOK ACADEMY OF ART, March 23-25, \$200.00 in awards; BRANDEIS UNIVERSITY, April 6-8, \$200.00 in awards; KENYON COLLEGE, April 14-16, \$500.00 in awards; KENT STATE UNIVERSITY, April 20-22, \$500.00 in awards; UNIVERSITY OF CINCINNATI, April 25-29, \$200.00 in awards; MILLS COLLEGE, May 4-6, \$200.00 in awards; DENISON UNIVERSITY, MAY 12-14, \$200.00 in awards, and BELOIT COLLEGE, June 2-4, \$200.00 in awards.

Those films that receive major awards in Ann Arbor will be given special screenings at the following theatres: CINEMA THEATRE, Los Angeles, May 20; PRESIDIO THEATRE, San Francisco, May 27; WORLD THEATRE Columbus, Ohio, June 9; VOGUE THEATRE, Denver, June 17, and the VALLEY ART THEATRE, Tempe, Arizona, June 24. At least \$400.00 will be divided equally among the participating film makers for these five screenings.
