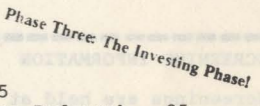
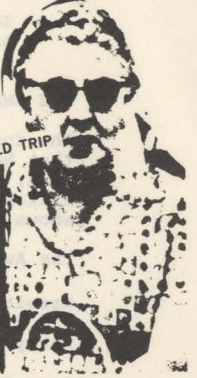
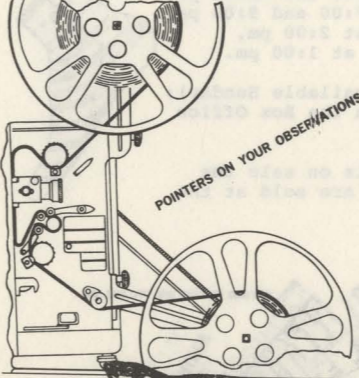
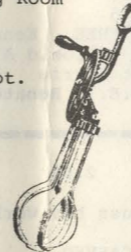
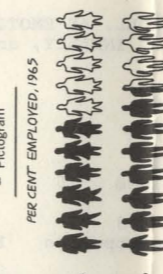
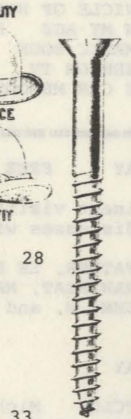
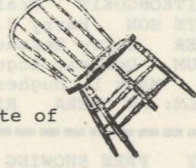
To the Most Promising Filmmaker in the Festival

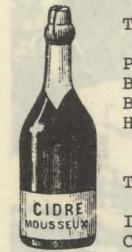
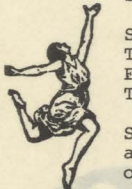
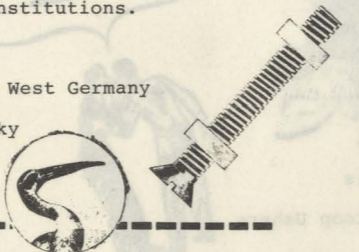
